According to the Clan Enlightenment post on the official blog, A Brujah has a passive, almost a neutral attitude towards their melee attacks after feeding. They can also enrage an opponent to while increasing the damage they take and the force of a wrecking ball, and unleash a flurry of unblockable strikes. Finally, they can slam the ground with enough force to send enemies into the sky and have access to a perk where killing foes activates their clan passive, even if they didn't feed. Tremere is a more recent clan that formed in the Dark Ages, but a powerful set of sorcerers and warlocks that stand as defenders of the Camarilla. They're secretive by nature, taking advantage of the unknown to instill fear, respect, and a bit of suspicion from the other Bloodlines 2 clans. The official Bloodlines 2 blog posted a breakdown of what powers these magicians have up their sleeves. They can perform a disappearing trick on any bodies they feast on by making them dissolve. A Tremere also has a rather cruel ability to make anyone's blood boil inside of them, with enemies and civilians alike drawn to their screaming. Other skills involve marking a target before explosively teleporting to their location to wipe out any nearby foes, cursing a victim so they explode the next time they take any damage, and a chance to receive twice as much blood when feeding. Banu Haqim vampires are a relative newcomer to the World of Darkness universe. These vampires of Middle Eastern origin were formerly the Assamites and are essentially assassins who kill for hire while also collecting blood to perform rituals that bring them "closer to their progenitor". The Banu Haqim have a few notable castes: Sorcerer, Vizier, Bedouin, and Courtiers. One thing they have in common is that they all embrace laws and traditions and, as such, regularly come to blows with other societies. The Ventru are the aristocrats of vampire society and know their place. They're greedy by nature and will always opt to leave their rivals under the bus if it means they get ahead. They're also immensely charming but are so used to the finer things in life that a Ventru outcast doesn't last long. Other vampire clans are in the game, including fan favorites such as theNosferatu and the Malkavians, but they won't be playable on the release of Bloodlines 2. That isn't to say they won't appear as new factions in DLC. Bloodlines 2 gameplayBloodlines 2 is primarily a vampire RPG, and your choice of clan will heavily influence your character's progression and gameplay. Brujah, for example, is a tanky brawler, whereas Tremere is more akin to spell-slinging mages. On January 31, 2024, we got our first proper look at an extended gameplay trailer. In it, we're introduced to 'Phyre', our main protagonist, who in the final game can be one of the many selectable vampire clans and gender identities. They are an elder in the vampiric community, and the version we see in the trailer is a female-identifying Brujah. While they're suited to combat, they're also quite impatient, which shows in the intimidating and aggressive dialogue choices available. The early mission we see has Phyre investigating a mark in her hand that's holding back her powers since her arrival in Seattle. She gets a tipoff about a Nosferatu called Willem, who may know the answers. She tracks him down to a GTN Distribution warehouse, and in the trailer, we see her confront him. Not only that, but she can communicate telepathically with an ally, Fabien, during the mission. While picking up a newspaper, we see that there are options for outfit choices and an ability tree, which will no doubt be unique for each clan. One of these powers is a vampiric sense that changes her view to highlight key objects, similar to Detective Mode in the Batman Arkham games. This is how she finds one of the collectibles in the game. Eventually, the sound of music leads her to Willem, who laments that she arrived before the song he was playing finished. During her conversation with Willem, we learn that another Kindred, known as Ysabella, is using the mark to sap Phyre's power, strongly hinting at a possible main antagonist and that he might know something about that. He is hiding information, of which the player has three approaches to get the info out of him.Phyre opts to remind him who she is, which sort of backfires as Willem leaps onto her and yells at her, causing her to wipe out. She wakes back where she started, commenting that he knows how to use the mark against her. On the journey back, though, she finds that there are now ghouls inside patrolling the corridors, but notes after feeding on one of them that these are illusions. After stealthily killing several ghouls, she's discovered and enters melee combat, where her brute strength is enough to decapitate foes. She also has a charge attack that can stun enemies that hit a wall. Feeding allows you to recover power and health, so it is encouraged. Feeding isalways at the core of Vampire: The Masquerade videogames - blood. In the original Bloodlines, you would feed on unassuming humans to regain health and discipline (or your 'mana'). Humans living poor lifestyles drain more quickly, whereas high-flying society types drain slower, meaning you can take more blood from them. As your health and discipline bars decrease, you have to feed again and again. Eventually, however, Willem screams at her again and sends her back to the beginning. This time, however, it seems the mannequins are alive. Once again, it's the illusory powers of the Nosferatu at work, and she's quickly outnumbered, but she leads them to a narrow corridor where her charging attack picks up all the mannequins and smashes them against a wall. The rest of the trailer is noted as rather spoiler-heavy, so we won't go too far into the story details, but music plays a key part in some of the puzzle-solving. We also learn about the main villain and their clan. In an extended narrative trailer, which features further gameplay and interviews with the developer team, we meet Phyre once more and see the third-person animated close-up conversational style. "We put in a rule that the non-combat gameplay should be about something only a vampire could do," The Chinese Room comments. This is demonstrated when Phyre is shown using her vampire senses and skills to solve a puzzle by breaking an illusion. We're also shown the narrative systems, where the player has the option of multiple dialogue options in response to conversations with NPCs. Phyre is noted as being "one version" of our protagonist - an elder kindred who has been asleep for 100 years and has woken up to modern-day Seattle. There are "consequences" to being an elder in a city full of kindreds - Phyre is experienced, a hunter, a stalker, but knows nothing of the modern world she has awoken in. Phyre has constraints that The Chinese Room doesn't want to spoil just yet, but has puzzles and mysteries to solve around what she once was, indicated by the markings on her neck and hands. A further Vampire The Masquerade Bloodlines 2 trailer was released in November 2024 and gave a brief look at the gameplay in action, including characters such as Benny, Tolly, Lou, and Safia, and combat. It doesn't dive deep into the story or spoilers, but the hauntingly dark environment and vampires look seriously impressive already. Following its announcement in 2019, the Vampire: The Masquerade sequel has been beset by a procession of departing leads and shuffled development studios, before settling into a worryingly long silence from publisher Paradox. For years we were wondering about what was going on with the Vampire RPG.Now it seems that Bloodlines 2 has had its own dark resurrection, landing in the hands of The Chinese Room, developer of Dear Esther and Everybody's Gone to the Rapture, and we've played it ourselves.Bloodlines 2 is now scheduled to release in October 2025. It's a little later than the game's previously planned first half of 2025 window, but the final(?) Bloodlines 2 delay at least gives us a specific month and keeps it within the year.Related Articles The sequel has had a long, fraught, and confusing gestation, originally scheduled for March 2020 before being pushed back to an unspecified time later that year. It eventually delayed into 2021, and then out of 2021, leaving its status a mysterywe weren't even sure which studio was making it.In 2022, Fredrik Wester, CEO at Bloodlines 2's publisher Paradox Interactive, tweeted that "the game is in good hands." Regardless, we actually get to see some of the gameplay produced by Bloodlines 2's new development home with The Chinese Room, with lots of clips of first-person superhuman vampire combat, featuring high-speed punches, blood magic, and more.Keep up to date with the most important stories and the best deals, as picked by the PC Gamer team.Vampire: The Masquerade - Bloodlines 2 character and story(Image credit: The Chinese Room)What do we know about the story and our character in Bloodlines 2?In Vampire: The Masquerade - Bloodlines 2, we'll play as Phyre, an elder vampire recently awoken from a century of vampire hibernation. Unfortunately for Phyre, they've awoken to less than ideal circumstances: They were in the Middle East when they entered their slumber, but now they've found themself in a derelict Seattle apartment building with a magical brand that's locked away most of their abilities and the voice of a Thin-Blood vampire named Fabien trapped in their head.Having an authored player character with an established backstory is a departure from the first Bloodlines game, where your player character was a blank slate. Phyre will be customizablein a Bloodlines 2 Narrative & RPG stream, Bloodlines 2 narrative director Ian Thomas said "there'll be a choice of clans, there'll be a choice of outfit, a choice of gender"but Bloodlines fans are, unsurprisingly, skeptical about the change in direction. It seems like we'll have some sway in Phyre's history: "elements of her background are up to you to choose, and what she reveals to other people, and what story she's telling," Thomas said.As Phyre investigates their rude awakening, Thomas said they'll have to navigate the vampire politics and machinations of Kindred society in Seattle, with player dialogue choices influencing Phyre's relationships and standing.What vampire clans will be playable in Bloodlines 2?The Chinese Room has confirmed four of the Masquerade vampire clans that'll be playable in Bloodlines 2, with two additional clans arriving later as DLC.Here are the four clans confirmed for the reborn Bloodlines 2, the Brujah are a clan of philosopher-kings-turned-anarchist-punks, its current-day ranks drawing from revolutionaries, radicals, and activists. Stereotyped as thugs and hoodlangs, Brujah tend to reject hierarchy and tradition, instead directly pursuing their individual passionsand tending toward a similarly fierce fighting style. As glimpsed in the Brujah reveal teaser video, Brujah abilities in Bloodlines 2 will focus on aggressive, superpowered melee combat.Tremere: Unlike most of the other vampire clanswho trace their lineage to vampires predating the Biblical Floodthe Tremere are instead descended from a group of Medieval mages who sought immortality by stealing a vampire's blood. Today, Tremere continue as occultists who seek and hoard arcane knowledge. In Bloodlines 2, Tremere abilities will go heavy on the blood sorcery, weaponizing their own blood as projectiles while boiling enemies' blood at a distance. You can see a brief look at their blood magic in the Tremere reveal teaser.Banu Haqim: The Banu Haqim have a particularly inconvenient dietary restriction: They thirst specifically for other vampiric blood. They're also, apparently, the self-appointed vigilantes of the vampire world, strictly adhering to a moral code and dispatching from the shadows those who don't uphold it. A sort of "assassin's creed," if you will. In Bloodlines 2, Banu Haqim characters will skew towards stealth.Ventru: Generally, the Ventru are the most aristocratic, genteel, and domineering. Snobby assholes with mind-control powers, in other words. In Bloodlines 2, they'll manipulate and dominate their enemies and prey, while building up their own defenses through feeding.As for any Malkavian fans feeling left out, don't worry. FabienPhyre's vampiric companions a Malkavian. The clan was one of several player options in the first game, and its vampires were portrayed as the "wise madmen" types. Our recent experience playing Bloodlines 2 suggests Fabien's portrayal is a little more nuanced, and offers a new perspective on how he understands and engages with people.(Image credit: Paradox)We've played Bloodlines 2, and it settled some fearsThe sequel's troubled journey and repeated delays didn't do much to inspire confidence, but PC Gamer's Fraser Brown went hands-on with Bloodlines 2 and put some of those fears to rest. He's cautiously optimistic, but dug how much the game "delights in leaning into the vampire power fantasy" by positioning Phyre as no fledgling vamp. They're an undead, elder monster with centuries of wisdom and power to pull from.Their power may be sapped, but our Bloodlines 2 preview reassures "the Chinese Room has gone to great lengths to ensure that you still feel like a supernatural apex predator to a degree not even remotely attempted by the previous VTM games."Even in a weakened state, Phyre wields incredible strength, speed, and telekinesis. Combat is snappy, chaotic in the best ways, and Paradox deputy CEO Mattias Lilja even claimed "people who have seen it talk about Dishonored." It's unclear how much player choice will actually affect story direction, or whether those choices will generally end up in the same location but with different tone along the way.(Image credit: The Chinese Room)What's the situation with the Bloodlines 2 development issues?Bloodlines 2 has gone through a lot, and not just delays. Lead writer Brian Mitsoda, who was one of the main faces of the game since its unveiling, was fired from the project along with creative director Kaai Cluney in 2020. According to a blog post by developer Hardsuit Labs, the decisions came as part of "organizational changes" to the development team. Speaking to Rock Paper Shotgun via email, Mitsoda said that he was "suddenly terminated" and that "this came to [him] as a shock would be underselling it."In October 2020, senior narrative designer Cara Ellison left Hardsuit Labs as well to join League of Geeks.As of February 2021, its Hardsuit Labs that's been fired. Bloodlines 2 publishers Paradox Interactive announced that the game would be delayed past 2021 while they change developers. "We have started a collaboration with a new studio partner to finish work on the game," Paradox said. "This has been a difficult decision, but we are convinced that it is the right way forward to do the game justice."After more than two years of wondering about the state of Bloodlines 2, we finally learned in September 2023 that Dear Esther developer The Chinese Room has taken over Bloodlines 2 development, brought in after Hardsuit Labs was taken off the project.How has Bloodlines 2 changed with its new developer?After its development shifted over to The Chinese Room, we know that Bloodlines 2 has changed up its gameplay mechanics and RPG systems, though not exactly how. When our own fang-fan Ted Litchfield spoke to to Paradox Interactive VP of World of Darkness Sean Greaney and the creative director of Bloodlines 2 in Alex Skidmore, we learned from Greaney that they "have been able to reuse a significant amount of art and level design" with Skidmore clarifying that The Chinese Room is using "a new code base with different gameplay mechanics and RPG systems."We also know it's still set in Seattle, but instead of playing as a recently-turned "thinblood" vampire, you'll now be playing as an established vampire Elder, recently awoken from a prolonged torpor.Beyond that, we'll need to wait for further details to have a more complete sense of just how much Bloodlines 2 has changed. The Chinese Room has promised more details in early 2024, including an extended gameplay reveal in January 2024.(Image credit: Paradox Interactive)What did we know about Bloodlines 2 before its studio shuffle?Given the fraught history of Bloodlines 2 development and its changing studios, we don't know how much of what we learned before 2023 is relevant to the current version of Bloodlines 2. With all its complications, it sounds like the game has undergone some serious revisions. Here's a summary of details we had for Bloodlines 2 while it was in the care of Hardsuit Labs, but again: Some or all of this might not be representative of what to expect from the game currently being developed by The Chinese Room.The announcement trailer sets a darker tone and established Bloodlines 2's Seattle setting, which The Chinese Room has confirmed is still the setting for Bloodlines 2. Hardsuit Labs released a 30 minute gameplay demo for Gamescom 2019. It gives a good sense for what it was like to roam around open Seattle in the earlier version.Paradox had confirmed that five clans, the Brujah, Tremere, Toreador, Ventru, and Malkavians would be playable in Bloodlines 2. They had also detailed 11 different disciplines of vampire powers, each with its own set of abilities. Some, like the super strength-esque Potency, the superhumanly speedy Celerity, and the Thaumaturgy blood magic disciplines are visible at least in spirit in the reveal trailer above from The Chinese Room, but it's unclear how much of the surrounding systems are intact.Hardsuit Labs had revealed a number of joinable factions, and had confirmed that there would be a version of the emotional blood "resonances" from the tabletop game, which provide different qualities to blood when drunk. At the time, the studio had estimated a single playthrough would take around 25-30 hours.
