One of the most sought-after figures is the 252 Deku (Battle), which sold out quickly due to its popularity. However, if you're looking for a more affordable option, the 253 Ochaco (Masked) from the 2017 San Diego Comic-Con is available for around \$300. Funko's online shop also has a limited quantity of rare figures, including the 252 Deku (Battle) and other exclusive items. These figures are highly prized among collectors due to their rarity and unique designs. The prices for these figures vary, with some selling for as much as \$1,000. All For One is another character whose exclusives are easily available for a reasonable price. His Pop can be found for \$14-\$20 everywhere. In contrast, All For One (Charged) is hard to find but worth the sale at an affordable price of \$14-\$20. The box lunch exclusive, All Might (Weakened), is relatively easy to find and priced at \$30-\$50. On the other hand, Mei Hatsume is a rare character whose Pop can be found for \$15-\$20 after her initial popularity led to her selling out quickly. In contrast, some Funko exclusives are difficult to find. Hitoshi Shinsou's Pop can be found for \$40-\$60 due to his limited availability at GameStop. Galactic Toys' exclusive Midnight is also hard to find but has a decent resale value, expected to sell for around \$50. If you're looking for an affordable Iida Pop, the 740 Tenya Iida is the answer to your prayers. He's priced lower than the regular version of All Might at \$60-\$80. Mr. Compress' Pop can be found for a reasonable price due to its limited availability during the 2020 NYCC event. Lastly, Wave 4 and Wave 5 are confusing, but many of their exclusives, including the commons, are easily available for a low price. There are a total of 9 special edition Pops currently available for Wave 4 & 5, including the Endeavor GITD for \$15, Mina Ashido Metallic for \$20, and Katsuki Bakugo for \$120. The Pop Towns collection also features a range of characters, with prices varying from \$10 to over \$400, depending on the item and rarity. Only One My Hero Academia Pop Available From Funko Towns Collection The only announced My Hero Academia pop from the Funko Towns collection includes an exclusive figure with Izuku Midoriya at U.A. High School. In wave six, likely released in January 2022, the list of characters appears to be mostly from season 4. Common edition pops include Mirio Togata, Tamaki Amajiki, and others. There are also seven special edition pops available for wave six, including Infinite Deku with Eri GITD and Eijiro Unbreakable Metallic. However, some editions may have been canceled, such as the Tsuyu Clear Hot Top exclusive Pop due to spoilers. The value of a collectible Pops collection lies in what collectors are willing to pay for it. Currently, the highly popular anime series My Hero Academia has over 80 Pops available for fans to buy.
